The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture has issued this permit under the authority of section 21 of the Plant Pest Act, act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162 § 21, (3 P.S. § 258.21(a) and (c)) for the purpose of preventing, delaying and minimizing the spread, dissemination and amplification of Spotted lanternfly in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The Participant shall effectuate, follow and adhere to the requirements set by the Spotted Lanternfly Order of Quarantine and Treatment, as of March 10, 2021, 51 PA.B. 1346.

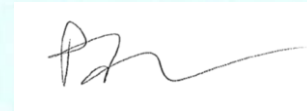

What to do next:

Train your employees

Penn State Extension has developed employee training PowerPoints in English and Spanish.

Distribute permits

Make copies of this permit and ensure placement in company vehicles.

Document your efforts

Recordkeeping of employee training, shipping records and vehicle/cargo inspections must be maintained for a minimum of two years. Inspections should be completed before moving within the quarantine zone, leaving the quarantine zone and entering PA from another area that has an SLF population.

If possible, incorporate SLF inspections into existing activities, such as daily inspections or safety checks, rather than keeping additional logs.

There is no required template for vehicle inspections, but documentation is required and must identify the person conducting the inspection and demonstrate an inspection was performed to prevent spread of the pest. Example inspection logs can be found on the PDA SLF Business page.

Do you need Permit Certification Labels?

If using a third-party shipper (other than USPS, FedEx, UPS or similar), businesses may need labels to attach to bill of lading or invoices certifying regulated articles (products) have been inspected and approved for movement out of the SLF quarantine area.

- If this applies to your business and you want a label template emailed to you, please request the labels by emailing slfpermit@pa.gov.

OR

- Incorporate the following statement (include your business name and permit number) onto your bill of lading:
 - "The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture certifies these regulated articles have been approved for movement out of the Spotted lanternfly quarantine area."

Businesses shipping products in their company-owned permitted vehicles do not need labels.
